



Camp Bird 14 Level








Camp Bird Mill (1930s)




Camp Bird Mill (1960s-1990s)







## Opposed to Proposed Changes to Ouray County Visual Impact

- Mining is the **HISTORY** of Ouray County
- Miners built the roads in the San Juan's to access their properties
- Miners built infrastructure and provided economic development throughout the county. **Do not add-in all of these access roads.** Leave the Main Corridors, only, as previously defined
- Mining is the **FUTURE** of Ouray County
- Today there are over 100 jobs in Ouray County associated with mining (Previously Idarado had over 300 employees – Camp Bird over 100)
- One year ago we asked that Ouray County encourage the re-development of mining so that we have a diversified economy and can provide jobs for our children and grandchildren that want to live here
- New companies such as Caldera Mineral Resources and Star Mining are just getting started on their projects. The Ruby Trust, Greyhound, Mountain Top, and others are trying to get started, again
