WARNING: Any person who, by use of force or other means, unduly influences an eligible elector to vote in any particular manner or to refrain from voting, or who falsely makes, alters, forges or counterfeits any mail ballot before or after it has been cast, or who destroys, defaces, mutilates, or tampers with a ballot is subject, upon conviction, to imprisonment, or to a fine, or both. Ouray County Referendum 1A

SHALL OURAY COUNTY TAXES BE INCREASED BY \$655,339.00 ANNUALLY BEGINNING JANUARY 1, 2020 AND BY SUCH ADDITIONAL AMOUNTS RAISED THEREAFTER BY AN INCREASE OF 2.6 MILLS LEVIED UPON THE TAXABLE REAL AND PERSONAL PROPERTY WITHIN OURAY COUNTY; WHICH IS A TAX INCREASE OF \$467,187.00; AND BY A ONE TIME 1.0% USE TAX ON THE INITIAL PURCHASE PRICE OF ANY NEW AND USED MOTOR OR OTHER VEHICLES REGISTERED IN OURAY COUNTY, WHICH IS A TAX INCREASE OF \$188,152.00 AND SUCH USE TAX SHALL SUNSET ON DECEMBER 31, 2045; THE INCREASED REVENUES FROM WHICH SHALL BE PLACED IN THE ROAD & BRIDGE FUND TO BE USED SOLELY FOR THE OPERATION, MAINTENANCE, AND CAPITAL EXPENSES FOR ROADS AND BRIDGES WITHIN THE UNINCORPORATED COUNTY; AND FOR THE ACQUISITION OF HEAVY EQUIPMENT, VEHICLES, ROAD MATERIALS, TOOLS, SUPPLIES, CONTRACTUAL SERVICES, ADMINISTRATION, AND PERSONNEL NECESSARY FOR SUCH WORK; AND SHALL THE COUNTY BE ALLOWED TO COLLECT, RETAIN AND SPEND THE FULL AMOUNT OF THESE REVENUES AS A VOTER APPROVED REVENUE CHANGE WITHOUT LIMITATION OR CONDITION UNDER ARTICLE X, SECTION 20 OF THE COLORADO CONSTITUTION AND COLORADO REVISED STATUTES SECTION 29-1-301, AS AMENDED, OR ANY OTHER LAW?

Cedar Hill Cemetery District Issue 6A

WITH NO INCREASE IN THE PROPERTY TAX MILL LEVY, SHALL CEDAR HILL CEMETERY DISTRICT, OURAY COUNTY, COLORADO STARTING JANUARY 1, 2020 AND EACH FISCAL YEAR THEREAFTER, BE AUTHORIZED, AS A VOTER-APPROVED REVENUE CHANGE, TO COLLECT, RETAIN AND EXPEND ALL REVENUES AND OTHER FUNDS COLLECTED FROM CEDAR HILL CEMETERY PROPERTY TAX MILL LEVY WITHOUT FURTHER VOTER APPROVAL, NOTWITHSTANDING THE REVENUE AND EXPENDITURE LIMITATIONS OF ARTICLE X, SECTION 20 OF THE CONSTITUTION OF COLORADO, INCLUDING THE LIMITATIONS SET FORTH IN SECTION 29-1-301 ET SEQ., PROVIDED, HOWEVER, THAT NO PROPERTY TAX MILL LEVY SHALL BE INCREASED AT ANY TIME, NOR SHALL ANY NEW TAX BE IMPOSED, WITHOUT THE CONSENT OF THE VOTERS OF CEDAR HILL CEMETERY DISTRICT APPROVING ANY SUCH INCREASE OR NEW TAX?
