# State health officials investigate a detection of H5 influenza virus in a human in Colorado

*Person had direct contact with infected poultry; public health experts say the risk to the public is low.*

4/28/2022

- Farm worker in Montrose County, younger than age 40, working with infected poultry
- Largely asymptomatic, reporting only fatigue
- H5 flu viruses do not normally infect humans nor spread from person to person; risk to humans remains low
- No other confirmed human cases in CO or the United States at this time



# \*It is critical to report sick birds or unusual bird deaths\*

- Sick birds or birds that have died from unknown causes:

- Dead birds:
  - Submit to the CSU Veterinary Diagnostic Laboratory in Fort Collins for free HPAI Testing: (970) 297-4008 or (970) 297-1281
- Multiple sick birds or multiple unusual bird deaths:
  - Call the Colorado State Veterinarian's Office (303) 869-9130 or the USDA-Veterinary Services Colorado Office (303) 231-5385
- Wild Birds
  - If you find three or more dead wild birds in a specific area within a two week period OR if you see live birds showing clinical signs of disease, please contact your local [Colorado Parks and Wildlife](#) office.



# Key Updates

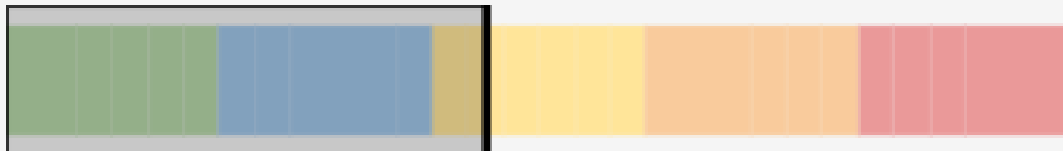
- Cases and percent positivity continue to increase in Colorado
- The 7-day moving average number of cases is 1,062 compared to a low of 303 in late March
- Hospitalization trends are variable but overall trajectory is upward
- Locations in the Northeast continue to see slow, steady increases in cases and hospitalizations
- CDC Nowcast modeling estimates 43% BA.2.12.1 in the U.S. and 36% in **region 8**
  - Estimated to be 25% more transmissible than BA.2
- BA.4/BA.5 variants- sporadic detections in U.S., first Colorado detection on Monday
  - Like BA.2.12.1, also more transmissible than BA.2
  - Limited data suggests greater immune escape than BA.2

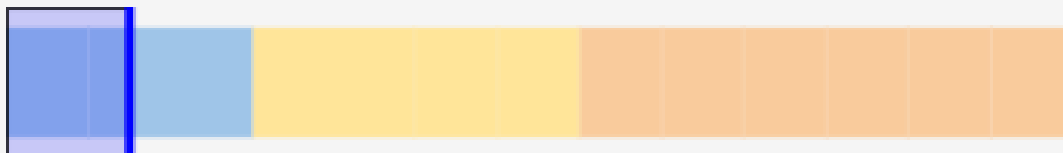
Ouray County One-Week Cumulative Incidence: 102.4

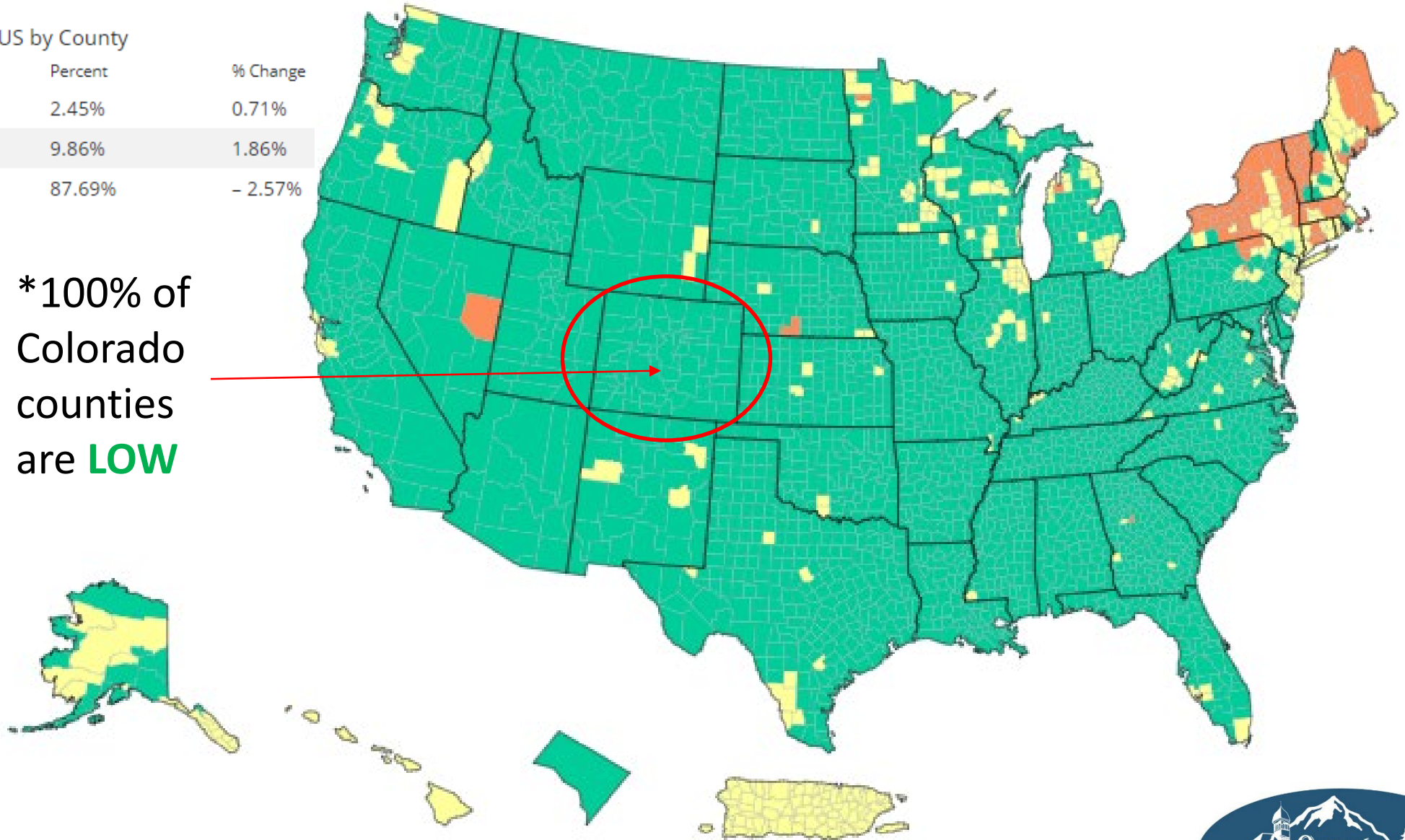

Patients with 1+ Doses



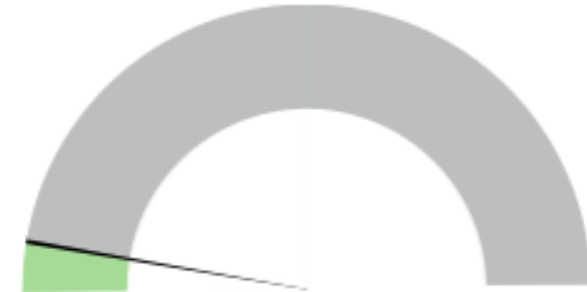
